Union Budget 2024-25

A Comprehensive Analysis of Interim Budget 2024-25 Unveiled by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman

Introduction and Overview

- Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman presents the interim budget for the fiscal year 2024-25 on 1st February 2024. This budget serves as a financial provision for the government till the full budget is passed post the general elections.

The Budget Breakdown

1. Key Features of the Budget

- Government expenditure: Estimated at Rs 47,65,768 crore in 2024-25, reflecting a 6% increase compared to the revised estimate of 2023-24.

- Non-borrowing receipts: Expected to reach Rs 30,80,274 crore in 2024-25, marking a 12% rise from the revised estimate of 2023-24.

- GDP: A nominal GDP growth rate of 10.5% is predicted for 2024-25.

- Fiscal and Revenue Deficits: Both targeting a lower percentage compared to 2023-24; 5.1% of GDP and 2% of GDP, respectively.

- New Schemes: Rs 70,449 crore is allocated for new economic schemes, waiting for specification.

2. Tax Proposals in the Finance Bill

- Tax rates are unchanged and tax benefits extended for certain entities till March 2025.

Policy Highlights in Various Sectors

- Railways: Major economic initiatives concerning energy, minerals, cement, port connectivity, and high traffic density corridors.

- Housing: Two crore additional homes under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Gramin over the next five years.

- Health: Nationwide immunisation management using U-WIN; extended health coverage for ASHA and Anganwadi workers under Ayushman Bharat scheme.

- Energy: One crore households to get solar rooftop installations; a phased plan for compressed biogas blending in PNG and CNG; installation of coal gasification and liquefaction capacity by 2030.

- Environment: Measures to boost EV manufacturing and charging infrastructure; Blue Economy 2.0 scheme launch; a new scheme promoting biodegradable polymers, bio-plastics, and bio-pharmaceuticals.

- Agriculture: Promoting investment in postharvest activities, expanding Nano DAP fertiliser use, supporting dairy farmers, enhancing the PM Matsya Sampada Yojana.

- Demography: High-powered committee to address population and demographic change-related challenges.

- Research: A corpus of Rs. One lakh crore to stimulate private sector involvement in research and innovation.

Comparison of Fiscal Estimates for 2024-25 and Revised Estimates for 2023-24

- Expenditure: 6% increase in the total projected expenditure; Capital expenditure surging by 16.9%, while revenue expenditure growing by 3.2%.

- Receipts: Estimated receipts mark an 11.8% increase.

- Transfer to States: The central government aims to transfer Rs 22,74,541 crore to states and UTs, an 8.4% rise.

- Deficits: The fiscal and revenue deficit targets are lesser than their respective figures for 2023-24.

- Disinvestment: Down from the budget target of 2023-24 and marking the fourth consecutive year of reduction in disinvestment targets.

Fiscal Responsibility and Budget Management (FRBM) Targets

- FRBM Act, 2003 mandates the central government to reduce its outstanding debt, revenue deficit, and fiscal deficit.

- In 2024-25, the estimated revenue deficit is lesser than that of 2023-24, thanks to a 11% increase in revenue receipts.

- Outstanding liabilities, which had been increasing since 2020, are expected to reach 57% of GDP in 2024-25.

- Interest payments are estimated to constitute 40% of revenue receipts in 2024-25, highlighting the significant share of revenue used for debt servicing.

Sector-wise Expenditure Highlights for 2024-25

- Defence: Rs 6,21,541 crore, the highest allocation, marked a marginal decrease of 0.4%.

- Ministries of Road Transport and Highways, Railways, and Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution: Received significant allocations.

- Department of Economic Affairs: Saw a significant allocation for new schemes.

- Communications Ministry: An increase of 11.8% is expected in allocation for 2024-25, primarily due to capital infusion into BSNL.

Restructuring in China's Military Leadership: Recent Developments and Implications.

Introduction: Change in China's Defense Ministry

- As part of recent developments, China has announced a change in its Defense Ministry's top leadership with Dong Jun taking over as the new Defense Minister.

- The appointment comes just two months following the removal of his predecessor, Li Shangfu.

- The announcement was made during a Standing Committee meeting of the National People's Congress in Beijing.

BRICS Expansion

Parallel to this, BRICS (Brazil, Russia, India, China, South Africa) recently announced its expansion by welcoming Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, Saudi Arabia, and the United Arab Emirates as full members.

Profiling Dong Jun: The New Defence Minister

- Dong Jun served as the commander of the navy from August 2021 before being promoted to his current role.

- He has substantial field experience, having been the deputy commander of the Chinese military's Southern Theatre Command which operates in the contested South China Sea region.

String of Military Leadership Changes in China

- The induction of Dong Jun marks a slew of deviations in the hierarchical structure within China's military.

- These changes include high-profile dismissals, such as the removal of Qin Gang as foreign minister in July.

Dong Jun's Influence on South China Sea Policy

- Dong Jun's appointment could have strategic implications in the South China Sea region due to his past role in the Southern Theatre Command.

- Given the ongoing territorial disputes within the South China Sea, Jun's background could significantly influence China's strategic approach to regional security.

Potential International Consequences

- The reshuffle in China's military leadership coincides with budding diplomatic relations between China and the United States.

- High-level dialogues between militaries of the two nations hint at a potential thaw in diplomatic tensions. This perhaps signifies a shift from the previous taut atmosphere following Nancy Pelosi's visit to Taiwan in 2022.

GK Points:

- BRICS is an association of five major emerging national economies: Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa. Recently they also welcomed Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, Saudi Arabia, and the UAE as full members.

Russia Assumes the 2024 BRICS Chairmanship: A Commitment to Strengthening Multilateralism

Overview: Russia's 2024 BRICS Chairmanship

- Russian President, Vladimir Putin, announced the initiation of Russia's 2024 BRICS Chairmanship on January 1, 2024.

- The chosen theme for the chairmanship is "Strengthening Multilateralism for Equitable Global Development and Security."

- This theme reflects Russia's commitment to fostering robust collaboration among the BRICS nations- Brazil, Russia, India, China, South Africa.

Approach and Strategy of Russia's Chairmanship

- Russia intends to maintain cordial and constructive cooperation with the concerned countries during its tenure.

- Its strategy will primarily focus on developing and enhancing BRICS partnerships in areas like politics and security, economy and finance, and cultural and humanitarian interactions.

Priorities for the Russian Chairmanship

with BRICS principles.

There are several key sectors that Russia will prioritise for cooperation, including science, high technology, healthcare, environmental protection, culture, sports, youth exchanges, and civil society.
Russia also stressed the need to garner increased support from other countries that align

Expansion of BRICS

- The Russian President underscored the requirement for introducing a new category of BRICS partner countries.

- Around 30 nations are being considered for inclusion in the BRICS multidimensional agenda, aiming to integrate new contributors into BRICS activities.

Focus on Foreign Policy Coordination

- Russia assures a commitment to aiding better foreign policy coordination among BRICS nations.

- Its focus lies in developing joint answers to international and regional security challenges and threats.

- The emphasis will be especially on the practical implementation of the Strategy for BRICS Economic Partnership 2025 and Action Plan for BRICS Innovation Cooperation 2021-2024.

Economic Contributions and Proposals

- The Russian chairmanship plans to positively contribute to energy and food security and seeks to cement the BRICS role in the international monetary system.

- It also has plans to foster the growth of interbank cooperation, and further the usage of national currencies in mutual trade.

With Russia's proactive plans and commitments as the BRICS Chair, 2024 is set to witness potential advancements and collaborations among the BRICS nations.

Growth and Diversification in BRICS: A New Chapter In Global Dynamics

BRICS: Expansion on the Horizon

- The organisation encompassing Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa, known as BRICS, is headed for a significant expansion on January 1.



- New nations set to join the bloc include Saudi Arabia, Iran, the United Arab Emirates, Ethiopia, and Egypt.

- This move will effectively double the membership of BRICS, enhancing its global influence.

Motivation Behind the Expansion

- The existing BRICS nations laid the groundwork for this expansion in August, sending out invitations to six nations. Only Argentina declined the offer.

- The central intention is linking leading energy producers with significant consumer markets in the developing world.

Progress of Participation and Acceptance

- Representatives from the future member nations have already started integration processes, as demonstrated by their attendance at a BRICS meeting in Durban, South Africa.

- They will also dispatch officials to the upcoming meeting in Moscow scheduled for January 30.

Journey of BRICS: From BRIC to BRICS

- The term "BRIC" was conceived in 2001, indicating the robust economic growth of Brazil, Russia, India, and China.

- It became "BRICS" in 2010 with the induction of South Africa, a testament to the bloc's evolving dynamics.

Increasing Global Interest

- Approximately 30 countries have shown interest in developing relations with BRICS, verifying its growing global relevance.

- Russia's Foreign Affairs Minister, Sergey Lavrov, has acknowledged the increasing international significance of the bloc.

Future Aspirants

- Nigeria, under the leadership of its Minister of Foreign Affairs, Yusuf Tuggar, aspires to join the BRICS alliance within the next two years.



Challenges and Setbacks

- Except for India, BRICS has underperformed compared to other emerging-market peers in the last five years.

- Russia's attractiveness to investors has been diminished due to US-led sanctions.

- Certain sectors in China, especially technology companies, face sanctions and potential investment bans, posing further challenges to the bloc's overall performance.

Pakistan to Receive Last Tranche of \$3 billion Financial Aid from IMF

The Immediate Financial Aid to Pakistan Announced by IMF

- Recently, the International Monetary Fund (IMF) approved the transference of the ultimate \$1.1 billion portion of a \$3 billion bailout to Pakistan. This bailout is a measure to support Pakistan amid its ongoing drastic economic crisis.

- This decision holds immense significance as Pakistan is currently confronting apprehensions concerning a potential default on forthcoming foreign debt payments.

- The IMF under the Stand-By Arrangement (SBA) of \$3 billion pledged to distribute a financial aid of \$700 million to Pakistan. This decision is aimed at bolstering the sinking economy of the country.

- The final decision concerning the release of funds will be made during an Executive Board meeting set to be held on January 11.

- Globally, 43 countries and one territory have been officially recognized as malaria-free by WHO, with Cabo Verde being the latest addition.





- A total of 241 unique Snow leopards were photographed. Populations varied across states with Ladakh accounting for the highest population with 477 Snow leopards, followed by Uttarakhand at 124, Himachal Pradesh at 51, Arunachal Pradesh at 36, Sikkim at 21 and Jammu and Kashmir at 9.



4: Expanded Understanding and Proposals for Future Monitoring

- Compared to the pre-2016 research which only covered one-third of the Snow leopard's range in India, recent findings increased knowledge to cover approximately 80% of the Snow leopard's range.

- The report advocates for the establishment of a dedicated Snow Leopard Cell at WII under the Ministry of Environment, Forest, and Climate Change for long-term population observation.

- It also recommends a periodic population estimation approach to be adopted by states and UTs every fourth year, to ensure effective conservation strategies and secure the long-term survival of Snow leopards.
